Mix active days with restful ones.



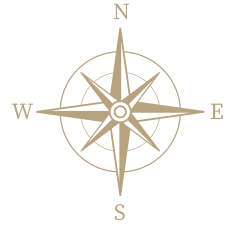

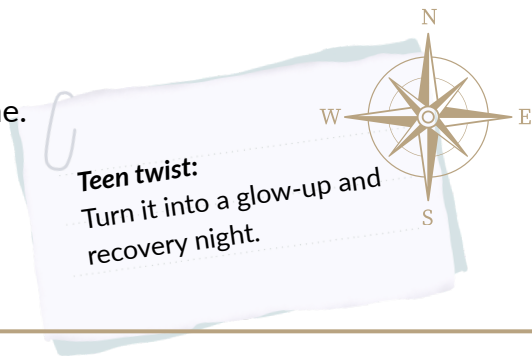




#4 DIY Spa and Wellness Day

Spend the day discovering a local main street or neighborhood.

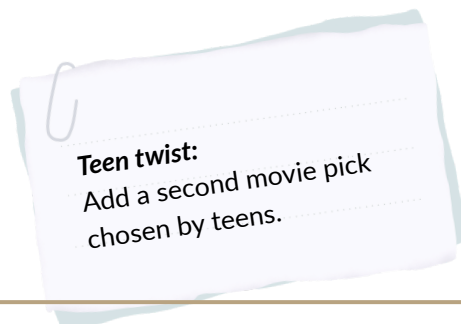

Watch a favorite film chosen by grandparents.

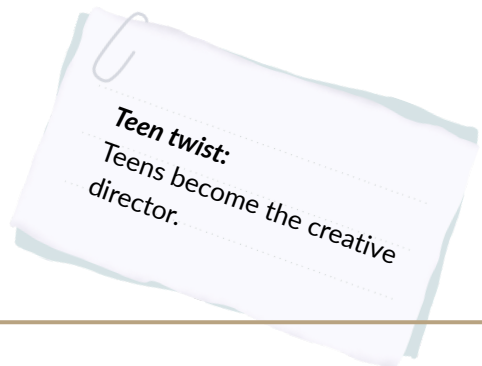

Rainy Day Backup Ideas

Rain does not have to ruin the fun. A simple backup plan can turn a gray day into one of the coziest, most memorable parts of your staycation, especially when it includes easy indoor activities that work across ages. Sometimes the rainy-day backup plan becomes the highlight of the whole week.



Indoor campout — Pitch a tent in the living room or build a blanket fort, then add flashlights, card games, and oven-made s'mores.



Family game hour — Pull out a few easy board games, card games, or a puzzle that everyone can join in on at their own pace.



Kitchen fun — Bake cookies, decorate cupcakes, or do a simple family cook-off with teams from different generations.



Storytelling circle — Ask grandparents to share favorite childhood memories, or have each person add one part to a made-up family story.



Craft table afternoon — Set out paper, markers, stickers, magazines, or paint for cards, collages, or scrapbook pages.



Indoor scavenger hunt — Create a simple list of clues or household items for kids and teens to find while grandparents help lead the fun.
